- 1. There is NO ENTRY FEE for this department.
- 2. All entries must be products grown in the counties that participate in the Eastern New Mexico State Fair and must be grown by exhibitor. Exhibitors may be required to present an affidavit that his/her entry complies with this rule.
- 3. Exhibitor is limited to one entry per class. One grower may deliver entries and entry forms for several participants.
- 4. Exhibitors must complete a 5" X 8" card per entry at registration with the following information: Name of exhibitor, Division/Class and Crop Variety.
- 5. No entries will be released before the close of the fair. Products which have deteriorated or spoiled during the fair will be disposed of.
- 6. Exhibitors may claim their entries, ribbons and/or premiums October 6, 2024, between 1:00 p.m.-3:00 p.m. NO ribbons or premiums will be

mailed.

7. The judge will award premiums only to those entries worthy of merit. Vegetables will be judged as if they are quality to be in a store. Exhibits erroneously entered may be transferred to the class where they belong at the discretion of the Superintendent prior to judging.

Decisions of the Judge are FINAL.

- 9. Entry Forms may be obtained on separate web tab or will be furnished at time of entry.
